21. LEADERSHIP TEAM NOTES from March 5, 2024

- Prayer and Devotions

This month we celebrate the death and resurrection of Jesus, arguably the most important event in history. Growing up in church or having celebrated often, Easter can become just another holiday. The Prayer Team encourages you to spend these next weeks remembering Jesus and His amazing love and sacrifice demonstrated on the cross.

Read 1 Corinthians 11:23-25.

This week, would you consider having a daily time of communion, remembering as Jesus asked us to? Grab a cracker, piece of bread, juice, pop, whatever you have. The value is in remembering what Jesus did.

- Sunday, March 10: Be thankful. Even in the midst of the ultimate betrayal, Jesus gave thanks. According to the scripture above, "on the night He was betrayed....when He had given thanks." He didn't just tell us to praise Him in hard times: He gave us the ultimate example to follow. Even in betrayal, He gave thanks.
- Maybe the song lyrics from the hymn "Nothing But the Blood" or "This is Amazing Grace," by Phil Wickham can help give words to your thanksgiving. Look up the words if you can't recall them.
- Monday, March 11: Confess your sins. A Holy God cannot be in the presence of sin. Our sin separates us from Him, but Jesus' blood and sacrifice paid that debt. As you take communion today, ask Him about sin that you need to confess and repent from. Listen for His answer. 1 John 1:9
- Tuesday, March 12: Dedicate today, and your days ahead to God. As you take communion, read Luke 22: 39-42. Jesus was honest with God, asked His Father His request, and surrendered to His Father's will. Use your time of communion to do the same.
- Wednesday, March 13: Seek discernment for your life. 1
 Peter 1:18-19 TPT "For you know that your lives were
 ransomed once and for all from the empty and futile way of
 life handed down from generation to generation. It was not
 a ransom payment of silver and gold, which eventually
 perishes, but the precious blood of Christ--who like a
 spotless, unblemished lamb was sacrificed for us." As you

take communion, meditate and ask God if there are "empty or futile" activities in your life, not necessarily bad things, but not the best. Maybe there are things that were good for a season, but that season has passed. Ask Him to show you the things He has for you that lead to your abundant life. Thank Him for His revealing to you. If you're right where He wants you, thank Him!

Thursday, March 14: Ask for your faith to be renewed. In Ephesians 6:16, Paul instructs us to pick up the shield of faith so we can extinguish the flaming arrows the enemy is aiming at us. We are being attacked by an enemy who is intent on destroying us. As you take communion today, refuse unbelief. Confess areas of unbelief and ask for more faith! The shield of faith is our protection when the enemy tempts us to doubt God, to disbelieve. Especially when we have no idea what's happening. As you remember Jesus' broken body and His blood today, you have what you need to lift your shield of faith AND extinguish the attacking arrows.

Friday, March 15: Confess unforgiveness. We all struggle with it. We deserve to be angry and hurt and unforgiving. But Jesus. Jesus deserves to be angry with you and me, hurt by you and me, unforgiving toward you and me. But Jesus forgives you and me. As you take communion today, confess unforgiveness. Confess your agreement with unforgiveness and your feelings of entitlement to not forgiving. Jesus gives us the best example. As Pastor Neil once said, "Don't waste the blood of Jesus." Take the body and blood of Jesus, and lift up in prayer people who have hurt and betrayed you. Ask Jesus to pour out the blessings you ask for your family, on them and their family. Choose, like Jesus, to answer pain with love; betrayal with blessings; disappointment with worship.

Saturday, March 16: Worship God. As you take communion today, read and worship with Revelation 5: 6-14. He is Worthy.
